Beverly has been an Altrusan since 1994, holding offices with her local Club, Starke, FL, District Three Board and the International Board of Directors. She served as Corresponding Secretary (1996-1997), Vice President of Membership (1997-1998), Vice President of Programs (1998-1999), President (1999-2000), and Club Treasurer (2000-2005) with the Starke, Florida Club. She served as District Three Financial Consultant/Committee Chair (2003-2005), Dist. Treasurer (2005-2007), Dist. Vice Governor (2007-2009), Dist. Governor-Elect (2009-2011), and Dist. Three Governor (2011-2013). She served as Chair of the District Nominating Committee (2013-2015). In 2016 Beverly was elected as International Treasurer at the

International Convention in Kansas City, Kansas. After serving as International Treasurer for two years she was nominated and elected as President Elect of Altrusa International in Nashville, TN in 2017. In 2019 Beverly will be installed as the President of Altrusa International in Reno, Nevada and will serve as president for two years. The following two years 2021-2023 she will continue to serve, for a total of 8 years on the

International Board. At the Centennial Convention in Nashville she became a Lucente Lamplighter of the International Foundation.

Beverly's formal education is in Special Education/Psychology, with a degree from University of Central Florida located in Orlando, FL. She has used her training volunteering as a drug counselor for many years, working with women at Place of Grace, a faith based drug rehab program and in the Seminole & Marion County school systems. She has also served as a Board member and Finance Chair of the ARC of Bradford County (citizens with mental handicaps); she is a member of the United Methodist Women, holding positions of Circle Chair, Program Chair, and Membership Chair. She is currently on the State Board of Florida Ladies of the Elks serving as Chaplain. Beverly was appointed by the Governor of the state of Florida to serve on the Judicial Nominating Committee as one of three Lay members for 4 years. She works in her husband's law office in the accounting department and serves as office manager. Prior to working in the Law Office, she was co-owner of her family brick business, Harwood Brick Co. with responsibilities including accounting and taxes. She is the Association Treasurer of Seychelles at Crescent Beach Home Owners Association. Beverly is married to Dudley Hardy an attorney, and they have two daughters, one son and four adorable grandchildren. Recently, this January, Beverly was named "**2018 Woman of Distinction**" for Santa Fe College in Gainesville, FL. However, her love for Altrusa precedes all her other interests!

For those of you coming up Hwy 44, you have the opportunity to get off on Route 66 only a mile or so from the Highway in Cuba, Missouri. Shelly’s Café is located at 402 East Washington, Cuba MO 65453 and is open for breakfast and lunch and it is a darling café. After you have lunch at Shelly’s, you can go down a block to the Wagon Wheel Hotel which is the oldest continuous operated motel on Route 66 and also has a nice gift shop. Delegates to Conference

At the International Convention in July, delegates approved a change to the charter strength of 15 active members. The new bylaw regarding delegates is as follows:

“Each Club in good standing in International that has a total active membership of fifteen (15) or less for whom dues have been paid to International, shall be entitled to one (1) delegates and (1) alternate. For each additional fifteen (15) members or portion thereof, a Club shall be entitled to one (1) additional delegate and alternate up to a maximum of five (5) delegates and five (5) alternates.”

As a result of the bylaw change, the number of delegates each club has may have changed:

15 or few members – 1 delegate/1 alternate

16-30 members – 2 delegates/2 alternates

31-45 members – 3 delegates/3 alternates

46-60 members – 4 delegates/4 alternates

61+ members – 5 delegates/5 alternates


